1. A brief outline of the Company's CSR policy, including overview of projects or programs proposed to be undertaken and a reference to the web-link to the CSR policy and projects or programs

Consequent to the implementation of the Companies Act, 2013, the Company has adopted the CSR policy through CSR Committee. The Company through its policy aims to bring improvements in the lives of the communities in and around our operations with an objective to energize and enable them to realize their potential. Empowerment results in enabling people to lead a better life. The Company's focus areas are Education and Skill Development.

This policy is formulated to meet the CSR objectives set out by the Company as well as the applicable statutory requirements notified by the Ministry of Corporate Affairs through the Act. This policy shall apply to all CSR activities / projects / programs undertaken by the Company. The CSR activities of the Company shall continuously evolve for a longterm sustainability of business, society and environment at large. CSR shall further align and integrate social wellbeing, economic growth and environmental sustainability with the Company's core values, operations and growth.

The scope of the CSR activities of the Company will cover the following areas but not limited to the same and may extend to other specific projects/ programs as permitted under the law from time to time:

- (a) Geographic scope: The approved CSR activities shall only be carried out in cities/districts in which the Company or its clients, including group companies, have operations.
- (b) Delivery scope: The target beneficiary of CSR initiatives shall primarily be the disadvantaged, impoverished, underserved and marginalised sections of the society. Emphasis shall be given to communities living around the area of operations of the Company with no exclusive benefits to employees or related parties of the Company.
- (c) Activity scope: The CSR spends shall be restricted to the activities listed below or any other activities as may be approved by the Board on a need basis:
- I. Promoting education, including special education and employment enhancing vocational skills and livelihood enhancement projects.
- II. Promoting healthcare including preventive healthcare.
- III. Promotion of sanitation and making available safe drinking water.
- IV. Activities intended to promote dignity to vocational jobs.
- V. Ensuring environmental sustainability, ecological balance, protection of flora and fauna, animal welfare, agro forestry, conservation of natural resources and maintaining quality of soil, air and water.
